	<p>Migrants workers have also become an integral part of our workforce in ASEAN. However, arriving on a foreign land and without much knowledge about the local norms, these individuals are often faced with issues which place workers in a vulnerable position.</p> <p>On the other hand, mental health issues are not given enough attention as a stigma is usually attached to persons with mental health issues. However, this silent problem needs to be addressed if we are to have a positive and sustainable work environment.</p> <p>This session will give youths an opportunity to hear from experts in the field on these issues and gain a better understanding of the workplace as they enter the workforce.</p>

With this in mind, the time is ripe to talk about the issues young women face in ASEAN and the role of both men and women in reducing the inequality between genders</p> <p>This session will give youths an opportunity to hear from experts in the field on these issues and gain a better understanding of the workplace as they enter the workforce.</p>

With an estimated US\$5-7 trillion worth of investments required annually (UNEP, 2016), the ability to obtain these funds remains a key challenge.</p> <p>In the spirit of the Paris Agreement and the Year of Climate Action 2018, this focus group discussion will discuss the role of sustainable financing in achieving a low-carbon, sustainable future</p>

Synopsis	<p>Communication strategies plays an important role in shaping public opinion, with the media acting as a watchdog protecting public interest and creating awareness. The issue of sustainable development has gained greater prominence in recent years with the 2015 Paris Agreement and the launch of the UN Sustainable Development Goals. There has not been a greater need to convince the public why sustainability matters and why businesses and individuals should care. What are the challenges in this field and how can we raise greater awareness on an issue where the sustainability rhetoric is getting mundane and repetitive? How then can youths effectively communicate and campaign for the issues that they care about to different audiences?</p>
